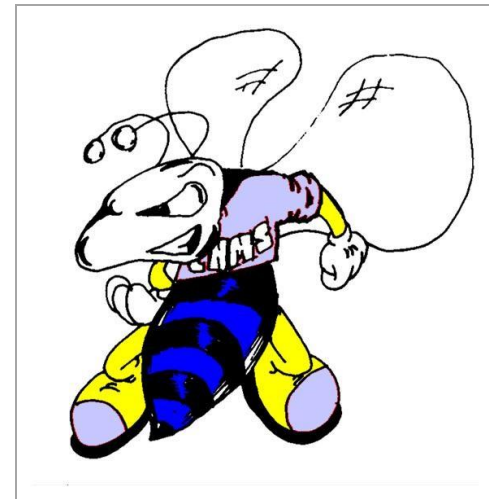

Late Bus

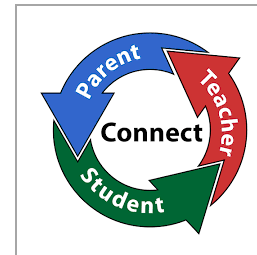

What is Title I?

Title I is a federally funded program under the ESEA (Elementary and Secondary Education Act)

Title I is a program through which school districts receive federal funding to provide supplemental instructional activities. The funds for each school district are based on a state formula that is calculated by the number of students from economically disadvantaged homes. However, Title I services provided with federal funds are based on the academic needs of students. The goal of the Title I program is to provide the instructional services the students need to increase student performance and academic achievement.

Title I programs can help:



- ❖ Children do better in school and feel better about themselves
- ❖ Teachers understand the needs and concerns of students and parents
- ❖ Parents understand their child and be more involved in the child's education

How You Can Get Involved?

*“Parent involvement is critical to student success and student achievement. Parents can positively impact their child’s school success by being positively involved in their child’s school experience in the following ways:
(Marzano, 2003)”*

- ❖ Keep in contact with your child’s teacher through telephone, conversations, or email.
- ❖ Participate in school-based events that are intended for attendance of all families (e.g., open houses, concerts, family activity nights, etc....)
- ❖ Serve as a role model, showing your child that you support his/her progress in school.
- ❖ Keep your child’s teacher informed about events in your child’s life that may affect his/ her performance in school.
- ❖ Support your child’s extra-curricular activities.
- ❖ Discuss ideas for parent involvement with your child’s teacher, school administrators or the Parent Advisory Council.

Parents Have the Right...

- to know the professional qualifications of their child’s teachers, including the degrees and certifications held, and whether the teacher is certified in his/her respective area of instruction.
- to know whether their child is provided services by paraprofessionals, and if so, their qualifications.
- to know the school improvement status of the school.
- to know the level of achievement of their child in each area of the state assessment.
- to be involved in the planning/implementation of the parent engagement program in their school.
